How does it work? What does it look like?


The free initial level of BuildUSA contains all of the basic setup, communication, and document management tools that are common to most platforms.







All three operate similarly. Let's look at Notes in detail.




Manufacturer / Distributor logs in and selects Notes






Manufacturer / Distributor enters coding and data detail.



Enter any CSI and Legacy CSI Numbers pertaining to the product Enter all specifications and characteristics of the product Optionally upload photographs of the product



Manufacturer / Distributor pays BuildUSA for Note position



Payment for Notes can be made online with a credit card




User accesses Notes via BuildUSA database.






User accesses & utilizes Notes via CAD, BIM or BuildUSA database.






Users receive current, users specific structured data directly from manufacturer / distributor.





Users can insert the Note directly into drawings, providing link for entire project team.

Note 07200A connects directly to listed preferred supplier information



Manufacturer purchases a position in alphanumeric note.

The note can reside on the architectural drawing or in the BuildUSA Notes database for user searches.
